Jacqueline Williams 83, resident of Chino Valley/Prescott, AZ since 1960 entered into eternal life on November 12, 2009. She took great pride in her family and home, hosting many family dinners and gatherings. Jackie was famous for her homemade coconut pie, coconut cakes and her chocolate chip cookies. She belonged to the Monday night bowling league with her close friends Ann Franklin, Buehla Morgan and Yvonne Morgan in the early 1960's. These four women took the trip of a life time to Europe in 1964 for 28 days where she was moved by the concentration camps at Dachau and inspired by the art and history in Italy. She was always well coiffed by her loved and dear friend Richard Alvarado for 18 years. She enjoyed her grand children, Marylan Johnson, Dwayne Johnson, Amy Johnson and Joseph Green. Jackie is survived by daughters, Debbie Johnson (and son-in-law Bob) of Chino Valley, AZ, Bonnie Babakian of Phoenix, AZ, Johnny Williams of Nevada and great Grandchildren, Alena Johnson and

Riley Johnson. She was preceded in death by her sweetheart of 50 years Jack and grandson Dwayne Johnson.
